Race around the buoys and back




The 'runner' gets out and runs through the finish line

Our Story

Beach Sprints developed from the emergence of beach games competitions and the desire for an exciting short, fast Coastal Rowing discipline. It first appeared in 2015 at the Mediterranean Beach Games in Italy. It then because the newest event to join the family of World Rowing disciplines.


The World Rowing Beach Sprint Finals were first raced in 2019 in Shenzhen, China. They were held in 2021 in Oeiras, and then in 2022 in Pembrokeshire, Great Britain.

As well as Beach Sprints there's Coastal Rowing – the endurance version with racing over $6-8\,\mathrm{km}$ – with racing on the sea or lake and goes back a lot further in years. World Rowing Coastal Championships were held in 2006 and now the Beach Sprint Finals are usually held on the back end of the coastal championships with some athletes competing in both.

Both disciplines use Coastal Rowing boats. They're wider than Classic Rowing boats with the stern flat to let the water flow out of the boat.
