'- It is a natual waterbody 13.5m width, 8 lanes The depth is approx. 4.5m The start tower will be renovated with some new wood. The start bridge will be the same however some of the fingers will be renovated New optical fibre will be installed at the venue Coaches would not be able to follow training and racing along the course as there is limited visibility. The OC would place a big screen in the athletes area and create a "viewing corner" for the teams There is a lot of space in the boat park area for all the team facilities (boat racks, team tents, ice baths etc.).	- It is a natural waterbody. - There are eight lanes with a width of 12.5m each. - The depth is approx. 16m. - The infrastructure at the Rotsee has been renewed prior to 2016 with total investments of CHF 16 million. Note that a part from the Rowing related infrastructure (albano system, pontoons), the finish tower and the boathouse, the majority of the infrastructure at the Rotsee is of temporary nature. This allows the OC to adapt the infrastructure to meet the event concept needs. From 2024 onwards, the installation of solar pannels on the roof of the Rowing centre as well as new communication network components (meeting the latest international standards and approved by WR service provider) are planned to be installed. Further improvements to the venue are being considered (e.g. additional pontoons). - The quality of the infrastructure is high.

TRANSPORT	- System planned, number of routes, travel times	 All the transport between official hotels and the venue will be provided. The OC will provide different type of buses and use a fleat with the capacity of 16 up to 120 people. Airport transfers from Milan Malpensa Airport and Varese will be provided by the OC. It is possible that there will be a new direct train line between Milan Malpensa Airport and Varese in which the train would be covered by the OC. 	- Transport will rely heavily on public transport as it is sustainable and efficient. It is at no cost to the teams (public transport ticket given to all hotel guests). - Selected accommodations (Seminarhotel Campus Sursee) will be serviced by the OC with also wheelchair accessible shuttle buses. 25 - 45 minute journey. - Airport transfer from Zurich airport to Lucerne will be provided by train. The train cost will be covered by the OC. OC chaperones will accompany the teams onto the trains. The OC will provide separate transport for team equipment from the airport.

EVENT PROMOTION	Impact of the marketing and promotion programme on the promotion of the Championships and Rowing	- By engaging with local tourism authorities and creating comprehensive travel packages, the OC want to enhance the visitor experience and maximize the event's economic benefits. - Key Strategies: Collaboration with Local Tourism Authorities, partner with Varese's tourism board to promote local attractions and create awareness about the event. - Develop joint marketing campaigns to highlight Varese and its surroundings as a premier destination. - Touring/Travel Packages: Design specialized travel packages that include visits to local attractions, particularly the four UNESCO World Heritage sites in the area. Offer customizable Itineraries catering to different interests (cultural, historical, nature).	- Lucerne have been very active in the promotion of their bid accessing every opportunity In the run up to the event the budget will be used for content creation, story telling as well as classical promotional activities Visitor packages planned in collaboration with other cultural events and toursim activities in the region.
PARTICIPANT EXPERIENCE	- Likely experience of the teams; - Appeal/attractiveness of the location; - Effort to differentiate - Spectator experience	- Attractive venue with an OC that has a new plan regarding a village atmosphere. Planning to upscale the festivalisation of the event (especially in the area behind the grandstand with a big screen, food trucks etc.). - The Varese OC aims to create a festive atmosphere during the 2027 WRCH by establishing a "Rowing Village" in the center of Varese. This village will be open throughout the semifinals and finals, providing a hub for spectators. - The victory ceremonies would take place in the Rowing Village 100 years of the Varese Rowing Club - there will be various activities associated with the 100 year celebration.	- Lucerne is know for its tourism as well as the Rotsee known within the rowing community as the "lake of the gods". - The OC is planning new concepts for 2027 such as a fan village in the city centre. This will further improve the athlete and spectator experience and portraying the athletes as heros in the city. There will be a big screen to showcase racing as well as host concerts and other local cultural events. - The victory ceremonies would take place in the city centre In addition at the venue there will be spectators on both side of the finish line creating a unique stadium effect for the athletes with over 5000 spectators The start area will also be accessible to spectators to not only see the starts but also a big screen will be provided The athlete area around the boathouse will be secure and only accredited personel will be able to access. This will provide the athletes with a calmer space to properly prepare for their race The OC want to create a rowing festival with captivating racing in harmony with nature.
LEGACY	- Impact on the city/region and on the growth or development of Rowing in the region/country - Use of the Championships to improve infrastructure at the Rowing venue.	Some new renovations on the course that would then carry over to future rowing events in Varese. Important for the region to keep hosting major international sporting events.	- To upgrade some of the venue, including renting/purchasing a wave absorber between the warm up/cool down, to extend the current victory ceremony pontoon. - To bring back a World Championships to Lucerne and continue to promote rowing in Switzerland. - A lot of the proposed renovations, improvements in infrastructure, concepts, staffing for the 2027 WCH will be carried over to the rowing events on the Rotsee from 2028 onwards.
