**World Rowing Circular No. 2 of 2026**

Ladies and Gentlemen,

**1. Athletes' Commission Elections and Appointments 2026  
Opening of the Nomination Process**

According to WR Statutes, elections and appointments of the World Rowing Athletes' Commission (AC) are held in the second year following the year of the Summer Olympic and Paralympic Games.

[Appendix S5 - World Rowing Athletes' Commission Regulations & Election Procedures of the Statutes](#) sets out the membership criteria, election and appointment procedures of the Athletes Commission (AC) members and the AC Chair.

From the ten members of the AC (Active Athletes - §2.b of Appendix S5 – or Recently Retired Athletes - §2.c of Appendix S5), five are elected at the respective World Rowing Championships for the relevant discipline by their peers and five are appointed by Council in accordance with Article 3 Election and Appointment of AC Members. Of the five elected AC members, four shall represent Classic Rowing (including Para Rowing), and one shall represent Coastal Rowing. The eligibility criteria and the nomination process are outlined in Part II §2 of Appendix S5.

Please note that, following an analysis of the process in 2022, the Council approved on 17/02/2026 the following highlighted changes to appendix S5:

Part III – Athletes' Commission Election and Appointment Committee

1. An AC Election & Appointment Committee will be convened at the beginning of the AC Election Year.
2. The Committee **shall** be composed of one chair and **at least** two members, appointed by the Executive Committee. The Chair of the Election Committee will

be a Council member; the other two members will be Council or Commission members. The Committee will be supported by the staff member responsible for AC election administration.

3. The role of the AC Election and Appointment Committee is to ensure compliance with the AC Election Procedure, and to supervise the entire election process and procedure and count ballots. The Committee will also recommend AC members to the Council for appointment, in accordance with Part I, Art. 3

3. Nomination Process

3.1 At least six (6) months prior to the start of the Senior WRCh in the AC Election Year, World Rowing will notify MFs of the opening of the nomination process for the election(s) to the AC. The notice will include details of the elective position(s).

3.2 MFs intending to nominate a candidate shall submit a completed nomination form, by the published deadline in the format communicated by World Rowing. 3.3 MFs may nominate one candidate only in any AC Election Year.

3.4 At least two (2) ~~three (3)~~ months before the opening of the relevant WRCh, all candidates meeting the criteria set out in Arts. 2 and 3.2 of the Election Procedures and having been duly validated will be declared admissible by the Executive Committee and the candidate list published.

MFs and candidates are reminded to refer the Purpose and Activities of the AC as outlined in [Appendix S8 – Bye-laws to Article 45 – Duties of the Commissions and Working Groups](#) and to [Article 54 – Ethical Principles and integrity](#).

### 4. Council decisions – Changes to the Rules of Racing Bye-Laws and Appendices for the 2026 season

The World Rowing Council approved the following changes to the Rules of Racing Bye-Laws and Appendices for the 2026 season:

2. **Rule 65 Re-Rows Bye-Law:** Changes were made to allow a re-row between crews from different races in the same round when the re-row is required to determine the crew advancing to the next level of racing based on time.
3. **Appendix R2 Boats and Equipment:** Changes were made to prohibit the use of substances that leave residue on the boat or oars. Blood oxygenation was added to the list of data that rowers can see during a race.
4. **Appendix R3 Weight of Boats:** Changes were made to specify what equipment needs to be removed from the boat prior to boat weighing, and the inclusion of a table of weights to be subtracted from the boat weight for equipment that is fixed to the boat and cannot be removed from the boat before the boat is weighed.
5. **Appendix R5 Regatta Roles:** A change was made to specify that members of the Jury at a World Rowing event should not also have a role representing a Member Federation at the same event.
6. **Appendix R6 Commercial Publicity, Sponsorship, Advertising and Identifications:** The change clarifies that a manufacturer can include more than one identifying element within a manufacturer's space.
7. **Appendix R7 Progressions:** The change allows the Executive Committee to approve alternate progression systems for an event, and changes were made to provide for better distribution of crews qualifying to the quarterfinals and semifinals.
8. **Appendix R8 Time Trials:** Changes were made to reflect references to the progression system.
9. **Appendix R10 Anti-Doping:** Changes were made to clarify that the anti-doping regulations, including reporting requirements, apply to all athletes competing in World Rowing events.
10. **Appendix R12 World Rowing Championship Regulations and Appendix R13 World Rowing Cup Regulations:** Changes to these Appendices specify that athletes participating in mixed events at these events are required to also compete in another medal event at the same regatta. Para rowing, Coastal Endurance and

Beach Sprints mixed events are exempt from this requirement. A section of Appendix R13 that dealt with a specific situation under the former progression system was removed.

11. **Appendix R16 World Rowing Masters Regatta:** Changes were made to allow the World Rowing Masters Commission to establish additional awards and trophies.
12. **Appendix R17 World Rowing Tour Regulations:** This Appendix was eliminated to reflect World Rowing no longer selecting candidates for rowing tours.
13. **Coastal & Beach Sprint Rules – Endurance** Changes are made to the race courses to require turns marked by two buoys under certain conditions.
14. **Coastal & Beach Sprints – Beach Sprints** Changes to allow PR3-VI B3 and PR3-II Group 1 athletes to compete in the Inclusion Mix 2x. Provisions were added for the safety of an athlete who has suffered a potential head injury. Changes were made to the duties of the Jury. A provision was added to sanction a boat handler who does not comply with the Rules including possible removal from the field of play.
