






Introducing the World Rowing Masters Regatta



The World Rowing Masters Regatta is the annual pinnacle of global grassroots Rowing for Rowers in the “Masters” age-competitive classes.

“Masters” Rowing begins at age 27 and has grown rapidly to comprise multiple competitive-age categories, even extending past 89 years of age. In Masters Rowing, the average age of the total Rowers in the boat determines the competitive class, allowing individual Rower’s opportunities to enter multiple competitive classes.

Across a weeklong sport-festival of Masters Rowing, Rowing Clubs and Rowers converge to compete over 1000 meters – a more accessible distance than the Olympic discipline of 2000 meters – pursuing the individual finals medals and the coveted Club Points trophy. Bringing together experience Rowers to showcase their skills and compete at a high level, the World Rowing Masters Regatta fosters camaraderie and sportsmanship among participants.

Unique to the World Rowing Masters Regatta are the mixed boat classes. With an entry deadline in the middle of the Regatta schedule, Rowers are encouraged to create new composite boats – comprised of members of multiple Rowing Clubs and genders - with their new Rowing friends made throughout the sport-festival.

This Regatta is a fantastic opportunity for Rowers of various ages and skill levels to come together in a globally competitive yet friendly atmosphere set against the backdrop of an iconic Rowing venue. Held in global cities, the World Rowing Masters Regatta is a vibrant celebration of the life-long health and social benefits of an active Rowing lifestyle.

Revenue Opportunities

It is the responsibility of the Local Organizing Committee to market the event effectively.


Bidding Fee: EUR 15'000

Minimum Investment of EUR 65'000


Enhanced Commercial Package:

Due to the competitive nature of the bidding process, this constitutes an important part of your bid. Interested parties are strongly encouraged to propose an additional investment package exceeding the standard fees specified above to reflect the unique commercial opportunities of their market - against further commercial inventory being granted.



The indicated event budget percentages are based on historical data collected by World Rowing. Budget percentages will vary according to local cost and conditions. World Rowing is committed to meeting with the bidding committee in preparation of the individual event budget.

The sample indicated Event Budget for a World Rowing Master Regatta is EUR 1'250'000. The budget indicated is used for modeling purposes only and intended to offer some insight into the financial investment by percentages, not by overall amount invested. The Event Budget will vary according to local conditions and costs.

- 6 - 8 Racing Lanes with 2'000m Albano buoys system
- Start Tower & Finish Tower

Welcoming "Boat Park"

- Space for more than 1'500 Boats (in Racks)
- Appropriate Number of Rooms for Event Operations (Anti-Doping, Media Centre, etc.)

Organizing Committee's will receive robust support from World Rowing across the number of areas including event operations guidance, media coverage support and advanced World Rowing services & products to support Hosts with event delivery.

Previous host cities were able to procure and or rent (as applicable) from World Rowing's service provider pool for delivery to the competition venue, reducing the complexity for the local organizing and establishing the foundation for fair competition.
